Janice Lachance: Let me welcome everybody. This is the 652nd meeting of the Federal Prevailing Rate Advisory Committee. It's May 16th, and it's 10 a.m. I want to welcome everyone. We are virtual, and it is being recorded. A verbatim transcript is going to be provided to all of the members for review at the next meeting.

For those of you who might not know me or remember me, my name is Janice Lachance, and I have the privilege of chairing this committee.

We want to start with introductions and taking attendance so that we know who's here and so that we can add it to our official record. I'm going to start with the Labor members. Let's start with AFGE, and I know, Jacque, you have a new colleague who's joined the committee. I see he's on. Thank you for that, Travis. Jacque, why don't you go ahead and maybe introduce Travis to the group.

Ms. Simon: Okay. Well, I'm Jacque, and I'm here. And my colleague, Travis
Reuther, is replacing Richard Loeb who retired, and he'll be a member of FPRAC going
forward. And he's recently been hired by AFGE as policy analyst.

Chair Lachance: At some point, Travis we'll talk about your mom.

Chair Lachance: Great. NAGE?

And joining us here in person is Brenda Roberts. She is the Designated Federal Official under the Federal Advisory Committee Act.

Ms. Bono: Good Morning. This Is Samantha Bono, OPM.

Mr. Eicher: Mike Eicher, OPM.

Ms. Bell: Cynthia Bell, VA.

Mr. Reels: Ralph Reels, VA.

Mr. Fendt: This is Karl Fendt, DoD, and we have various wage staff on the line as well.

Chair Lachance: Great, Karl. You've got a bit of an echo. I don't know if you have two mics going, but—

Mr. Fendt: Yeah, I'm trying to figure something out. My apologies.

Chair Lachance: No, it's all right, just wanted you to know.

And we do have a few people who registered to listen in. Would you like to introduce yourselves? I see Mr. George is here with us.

Mr. George: My name is Edward George. I'm the president of the AFGE Local 1647 at Tobyhanna Army Depot. And I thank you Chairman and the Board for having me today.

Chair Lachance: Great. Of course. Anyone else?

Ms. Friedman: Yes. Drew Friedman. I'm a reporter with Federal News Network just listening in here.

Chair Lachance: Great. Thank you, Drew.

LCDR Pulliam: Lieutenant Commander Dan Pulliam. I'm here. United States

Navy. I'm the Public Works Officer for Naval Support Activity Monterey. Just listening in.

Chair Lachance: That's great. Thank you.

Anyone else?

Chair Lachance: Thank you all for that.

We do have under our announcement section an update about the recommendation that FPRAC made in December asking OPM to change the regulatory criteria for defining and maintaining FWS wage areas. And Mark can give us the latest on that.

Mr. Allen: The last time we met, I believe I mentioned that OPM staff were drafting a proposed regulation to be presented to the Director of OPM. That draft is working its way through the internal clearance process within OPM going through editing. It has not yet reached the Director. It should get to the Director in the coming weeks, but I don't have a definite time frame for it to clear our internal review processes yet. But it's moving forward. I can say that.

Ms. Simon: I was told that it would be early April and then later—end of April at the very latest, and here we are getting close to the end of May, and it's not even at the OPM Director's desk, let alone interagency review. What's going on?

Mr. Allen: All I can say is that it's still working its way through the internal clearance process, and I don't have any further information I can share on that. There are a number of processes we need to go through before it would reach the Director.

Ms. Simon: Well, I'm afraid of what the process might be for slowing this down.

But in any case, can I formally ask our Chair, Janice, to please try to intervene and get this thing moving? Because it's just unconscionable how long it's taking.

Chair Lachance: I understand, and I will. Thank you. I will do that.

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Ms. Simon: Thanks.

Chair Lachance: Anyone else? Any other comments or questions?

through this process, it's stalled in one way or another. It seems like there's a lot of

roadblocks put in front of us when this is a process that's clearly stated on how it's

supposed to be filed, and it's a little frustrating to the employees that this is disparities

going on for 15 years. And every time we get it to this step of the process, it seems to

stop when we've had positive reviews from the FPRAC board twice in the past, and

there was either no OPM Director or no movement was made. It seems like this is just

another stall tactic to not give what's fair and equitable to all employees involved.

Thank you.

Chair Lachance: Thank you for that.

IV. New Business

a. Definition of Saratoga County, NY to a Nonappropriated Fund Federal Wage
 System Wage Area 653-MGT-1

Chair Lachance: Under New Business, we do have a document. It's numbered 652-MGT-1, and it's the definition of Saratoga County, New York, to a nonappropriated fund FWS wage area, and Mark can introduce the item for us.

Mr. Allen: Sure. This is a fairly simple case for the committee to review and provide a recommendation on. OPM did receive a request from the Department of Defense on behalf of the Department of the Navy to add the Naval Support Facility Saratoga Springs in Saratoga County, New York, to a nonappropriated fund wage area, and the clearest way to look at this thing is that it would affect one nonappropriated fund employee.

If we look at the maps that are included in the package, you'd see that Saratoga County is just north of Schenectady and Albany in New York, and those two counties are already part of the Jefferson, New York, nonappropriated fund wage area. So we're recommending that Saratoga County be added to the Jefferson wage schedule, not affecting any impact at all on that employee, who has already been paid from that wage schedule.

We would propose regulations to fully document that it's the appropriate wage treatment for the employee there, and any future employees who are under the Federal Wage System on the nonappropriated fund side would be employed at that activity in the future.
