Subject: 1998 Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Program: Significant Plan

Changes

PURPOSE

This letter transmits lists of significant events affecting certain plans during the upcoming FEHB open season. Please note that some of these events will require action on the part of agencies and enrollees. Please also note that an unusually high number of plans are dropping out of the Program at the end of 1998. Since employees in these plans **must** enroll in new plans during open season if they are to continue insurance coverage in 1999, we ask that you disseminate this list widely within your agencies.

- 1. **What must employees do?** Employees in terminating plans (Attachment 1) or in terminating codes (Attachment 3) **must** choose a new health plan during open season. (Standard option enrollees in the plan in Attachment 2 will be transferred to the plan's high option automatically.)
- 2. New coverage. Coverage under an enrollee's new health plan will be effective the first day of the pay period beginning on or after January 1, 1999; for most employees this will be January 3. Enrollees will remain covered and receive benefits under the old plan until coverage under the new plan becomes effective. [However, please note that we recently proposed a regulatory change that will make all open season changes effective on January 1, regardless of when the pay period begins. We will provide you with more information about this as soon as possible.]
- 3. Plan notification. The plans in Attachments 1 and 3 have been instructed to notify

enrollees of the need to select new health plans for 1999. However, some plans' enrollment and address lists may not be up to date.

4. What must agencies do? Agencies must notify employees in these terminating plans and enrollment codes of the need to select new plans to avoid losing coverage. This is especially important since many employees will not receive a copy of the FEHB Guide and will therefore be unable to check the comparison chart to see if their plans will still be participating in 1999.

We strongly recommend that you notify your employees by distributing copies of these lists to each employee, along with your agency's notice to employees about open season.

We also recommend that, before open season ends, you follow up with employees in these plans who have not made a new election and remind them to select new plans.

5. **Belated changes.** Despite these precautions, there are likely to be some employees who do not get the word to change plans during open season. We encourage you to be liberal in using your authority to accept belated open season changes from employees enrolled in terminating plans/enrollment codes.

SERVICE AREA REDUCTIONS

Attachment 4: Plans Significantly Reducing Their Service Areas Without Terminating an Enrollment Code

Enrollees in the service areas being terminated should consider choosing new plans for 1999. Enrollees who do not choose new plans will have to travel to their plan's remaining service area to obtain medical care in order to receive full benefits from the plan.

Attachment 5: Plans Splitting a Service Area

Enrollees in these plans should consider changing their code (or plan) during open season. Otherwise, they will have to travel to the area served by their enrollment code to obtain medical care in order to receive full benefits from the plan.

Agency Action Required. You may wish to distribute a copy of these lists to each employee, along with your agency's notice to employees about open season. If you don't distribute the lists, remind employees to check their new health plan brochures carefully to see if there have been any changes to their plans' service areas that will affect them.

OTHER SERVICE AREA CHANGES

Attachment 6: Service Area Consolidations

These plans are consolidating their services; i.e., changing from one or more enrollment areas to one. The service areas will remain the same, but they will be included under one enrollment code. Enrollees in the "departing" enrollment codes will be transferred automatically to the remaining enrollment code.
